Not sure where to start?

- · Check your Academic Progress in Workday or contact an Advisor in your faculty to determine the best time to go abroad
 - o which credits do you still need to fulfill (e.g. requirements, electives...)
 - when are your degree required courses offered at UBC? (e.g. only offered in term 1)
- Review the Partner University Pages for institutions you're interested in to:
 - o connect to the partner's website to find out what courses are typically offered and their semester dates
 - verify the credit equivalency ratio to determine how the partner credits will transfer back to UBC
 - o use the <u>Transfer Credit Course Search*</u> to see examples of courses previous Go Global students have transferred back from exchange in the last 5 years.
 - * Not all previously evaluated courses listed are offered every session at the partner university. This is a general guideline only. If you don't see a particular course listed, it simply means that it has not yet been taken by a UBC student yet. Go Global will provide more information on this process after you have been matched and prior to your departure.
- Review the partner university's own course website:
 - o note that course catalogues for your term abroad might not be published yet; choose potential courses from the current or most recent listings
 - o look for courses that are open to exchange students
 - o remember to check the language of instruction
 - o check the level of the course and if there are any pre-requisites
- Review the exchange Transfer Credit Process for your UBC campus (<u>Vancouver</u> or <u>Okanagan</u>) to understand how your exchange credits transfer back to UBC:
 - depending on the course content, courses you take on exchange can transfer back as equivalent to a specific UBC course (e.g. PSYC 331), unassigned credit at the department level (e.g. PSYC 3rd), unassigned credit at the faculty level (e.g. ARTS 1st), or Elective credit (ELEV 1st).
 - note relevant deadlines for initiating review of your courses for transfer credit
