Prepare Ahead Short Presentations

- 1. Every day a different participant will be assigned to do the morning briefing. This is an opportunity to review the itinerary for the day and also prepare for the activities through stretching, meditation or physical activity. Imagine you are assigned to brief our group on a visit to Uluru. Please prepare a 5-10 minute presentation on your morning briefing what will it look like? What group activity would you plan? What information for the day would you include?
- 2. This program is based on reciprocal engagement and learning from one another. Students will be asked to contribute a short workshop to the program on a topic of their choice: this could be a leadership workshop, skills workshop, information workshop, etc. Imagine you are leading a workshop. Please prepare a 5-10 minute overview of what your workshop would be and what you would want an Indigenous student in Australia to take away from it. What would you want them to learn about Canada, the Okanagan/Vancouver, UBC Okanagan/Vancouver and/or your own community?

Participating in an international learning program is unlike any classroom experience on campus at UBC. Since the experience is unique we have developed a few guidelines to ensure you and your classmates are able to engage safely while getting the most out of the experience.

The UBC-Monash Indigenous Leaders Program (hereafter "the Program") offers an intensive learning format that includes group travel, shared accommodations, field trips, and other program related activities. The experience involves a high level of interaction among participants, Program Directors (PD), and members of the local community.

q Each Program Director may establish a set of additional behavioral requirements, respective to the unique demands of each Program (such as a curfew). I am responsible for reading, understanding and adhering to those requirements.
q I am aware that should I have a disability or pre-existing health conditions (mental or physical) which could impact my participation in the Program or should I require academic accommodation, I can call the call the Centre for Accessibility -Vancouver (604 822-5844) or the Disability Resource Centre - Okanagan (250-807-8053) well before the start of the program to setup a meeting with an Accessibility Advisor.

q Notwithstanding my acceptance by Go Global and the Program Directors into the Program, my participation in the Program is dependent on maintaining a 70% average in my most recent academic term of full-time studies prior to my Global Seminar.
q I will attend the mandatory pre-departure sessions held by both Go Global and my Program Directors.
q I will complete all of the Student Safety Abroad program requirements including completing the Student Safety Abroad Travel Registry before I go on my Global Seminar.
o I will obtain and maintain appropriate travel and medical insurance coverage for the duration of the Program as required by UBC Students Safety Abroad Policy.
o I acknowledge that I am responsible for my own personal safety and will make good decisions regarding my safety, including following any safety recommendations issued by the Program Directors and UBC.
